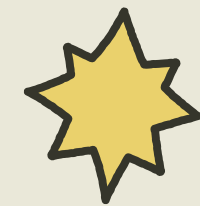
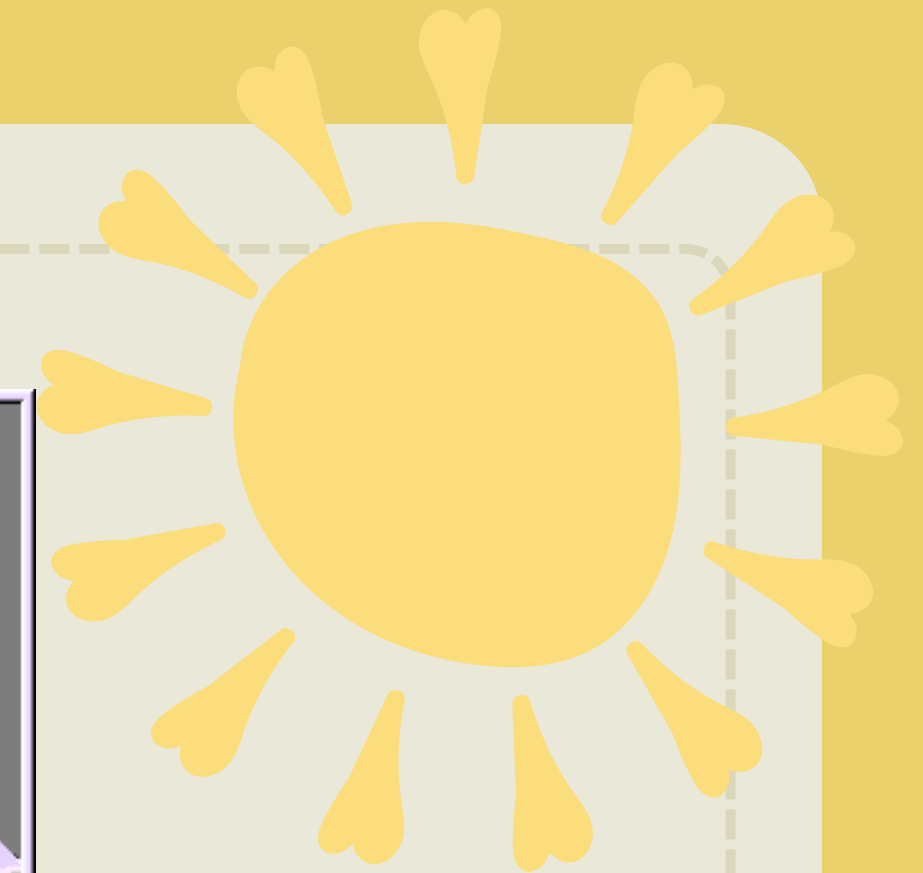


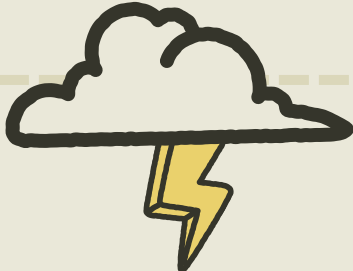
Discover Drama, Greece

By Air: The nearest airports are in Kavala, about 50 km and Thessaloniki 160km from Drama. From there, you can rent a car or take a bus to reach the city.

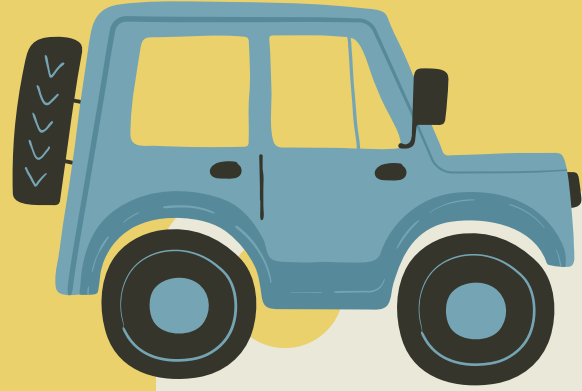


By Train: Drama is connected by train to Thessaloniki and Athens. The scenic route from Thessaloniki offers beautiful views of the countryside.

Spring (March to May): Ideal for nature lovers, as the flora blooms and the weather is mild.



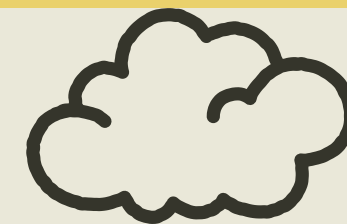
Summer (June to August): Perfect for outdoor activities, festivals, and exploring the city.

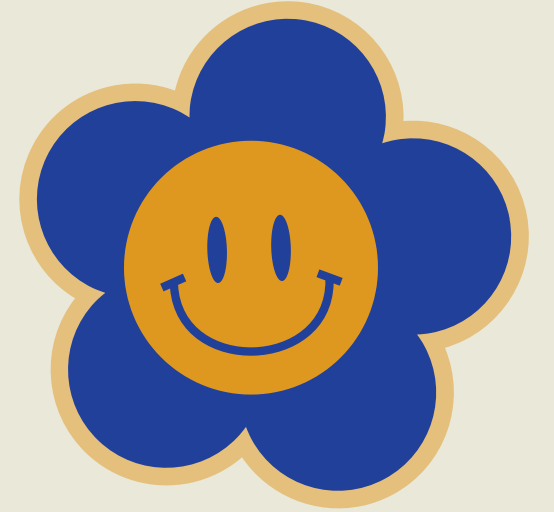

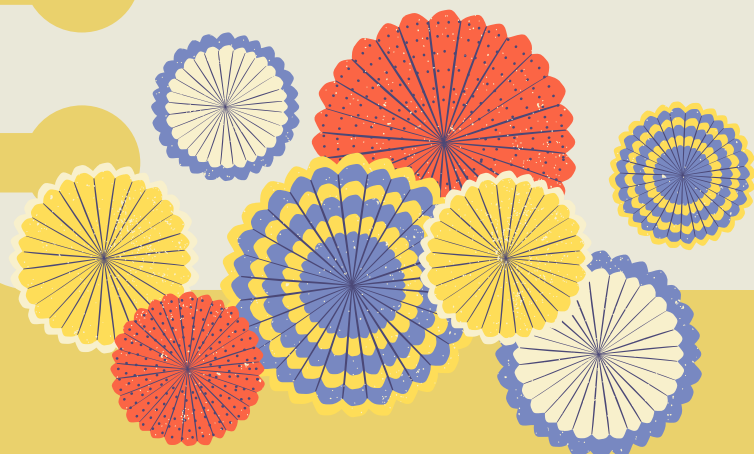

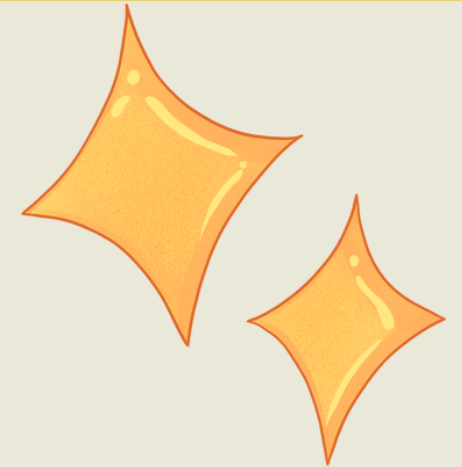

Helpful Travel Advice



Wi-Fi is widely available in hotels, cafes, and restaurants, but it's always good to have a mobile data backup, especially when traveling to remote areas.



English is widely spoken in tourist areas.
Some basic Greek phrases are "Kalimera" (Good morning), "Kalispera" (Good evening), "Kalinixta" (Good night), "Efcharistó" (Thank you), and "Parakaló" (You are welcome).

Keep Google Translate handy for any language barriers, especially if you venture into rural areas where English might be less common.

Travel Insurance: Make sure you have travel insurance that covers health care.

Tap Water: Tap water is safe to drink in Drama, but if you prefer bottled water, it's widely available.

Keep emergency numbers handy: 112 for general emergencies, 100 for the police, 166 for an ambulance, and 199 for the fire department.
