# INTRODUCTION

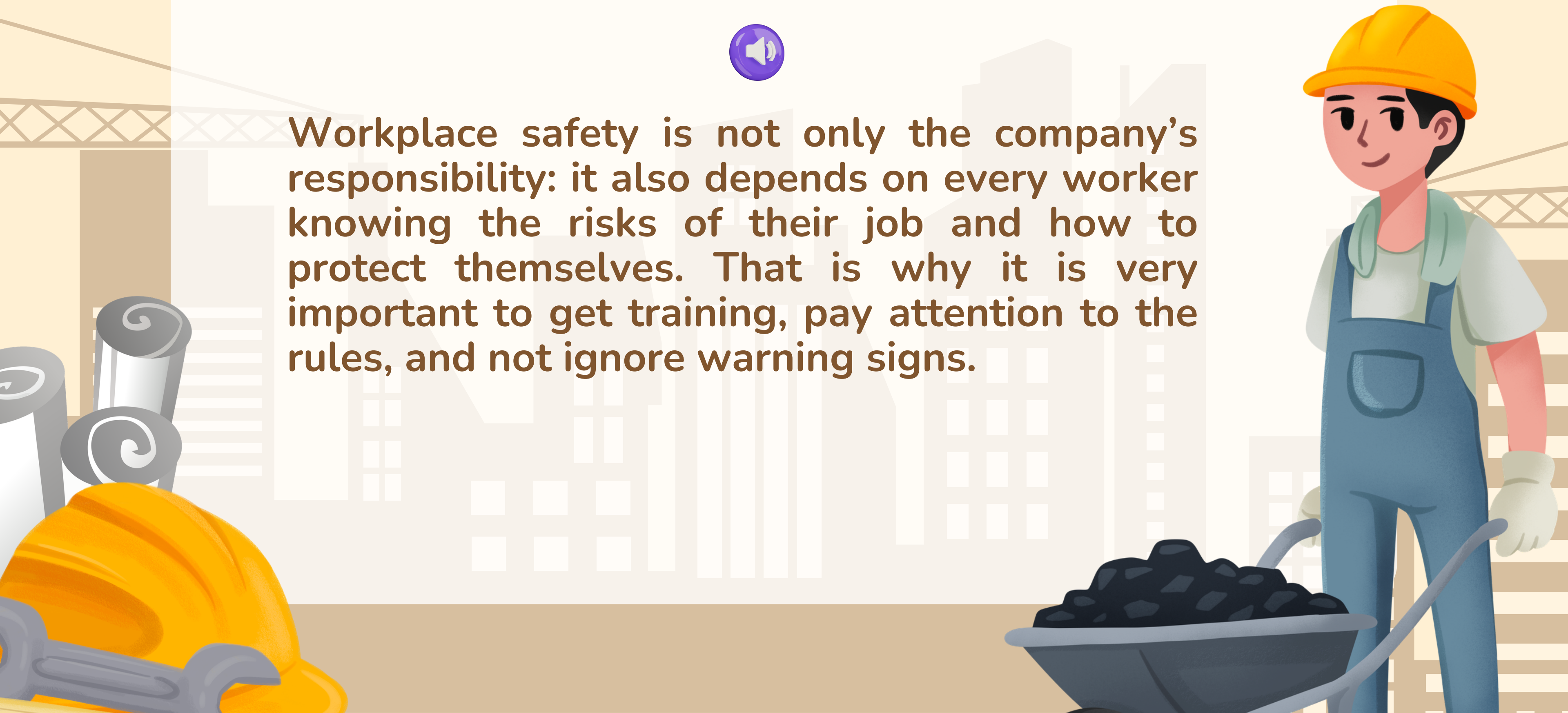


When we talk about safety and health at work, we mean all the ways that make it possible for people to do their job without being in danger. Every year, in Europe, thousands of workers lose their lives or have accidents while working. Almost all of these events could have been avoided, and many of them with simple precautions, such as wearing a helmet on a building site, having enough rest hours in transport jobs, or checking machines before using them.





Workplace safety is not only the company's responsibility: it also depends on every worker knowing the risks of their job and how to protect themselves. That is why it is very important to get training, pay attention to the rules, and not ignore warning signs.





Taking care of safety at work means protecting everyone's life and health, but it also ensures that we can work in better conditions, be more productive, and go home safe and healthy every day. In short, workplace safety is not an extra; it is an essential part of any job.

- 1. Understand how many deadly work accidents happened and what their main features are.
- 2. Study and share safety measures to reduce accidents in the most dangerous sectors.
- 3. Discover how much young people know about work safety.
- 4. Improve skills in using digital tools, researching, analysing data, communicating and making videos.
- 5. Encourage social awareness and personal responsibility to prevent work accidents.

- Investigate the **deaths from work accidents** that happened in your country during 2024.
- Write the **five jobs** or work sectors where more people died in that time. Also write the four main **causes** of the accidents in those jobs/sectors and four possible **actions** to avoid them.
- Prepare a short **presentation** of the data found in each country using the **table** model below. Add bar **graphs** and pie charts.
- Important: The numbers do not have to be exact, and we do not want to compare countries.
- The aim is for students to understand how important job training is to work safely. Make the information simple, clear and easy to understand.
- Presentation of the data, graphs and table.

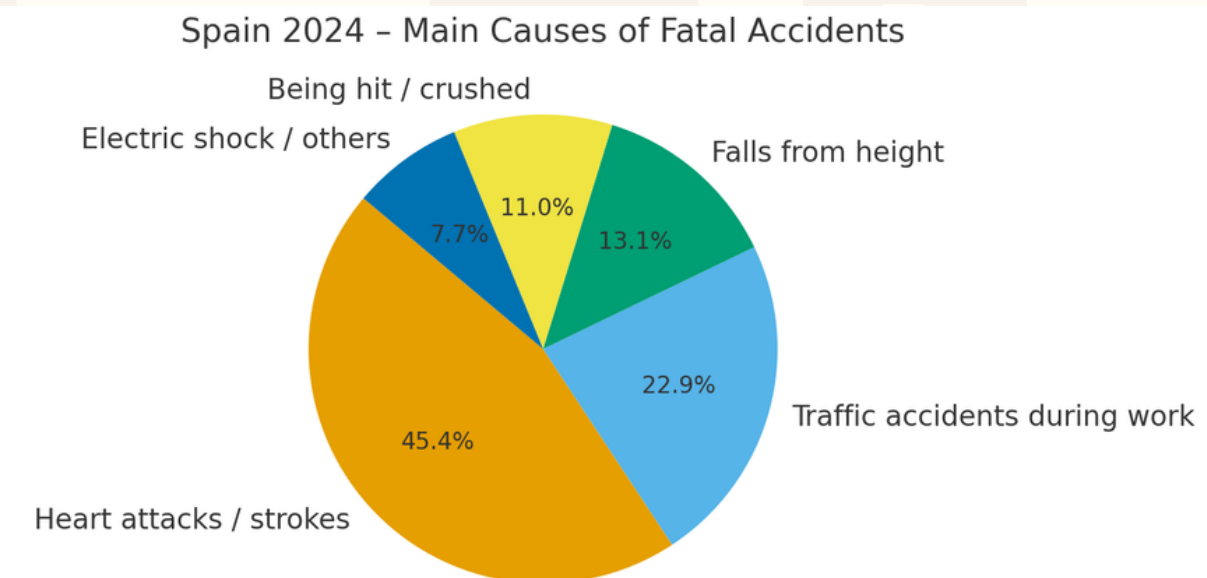
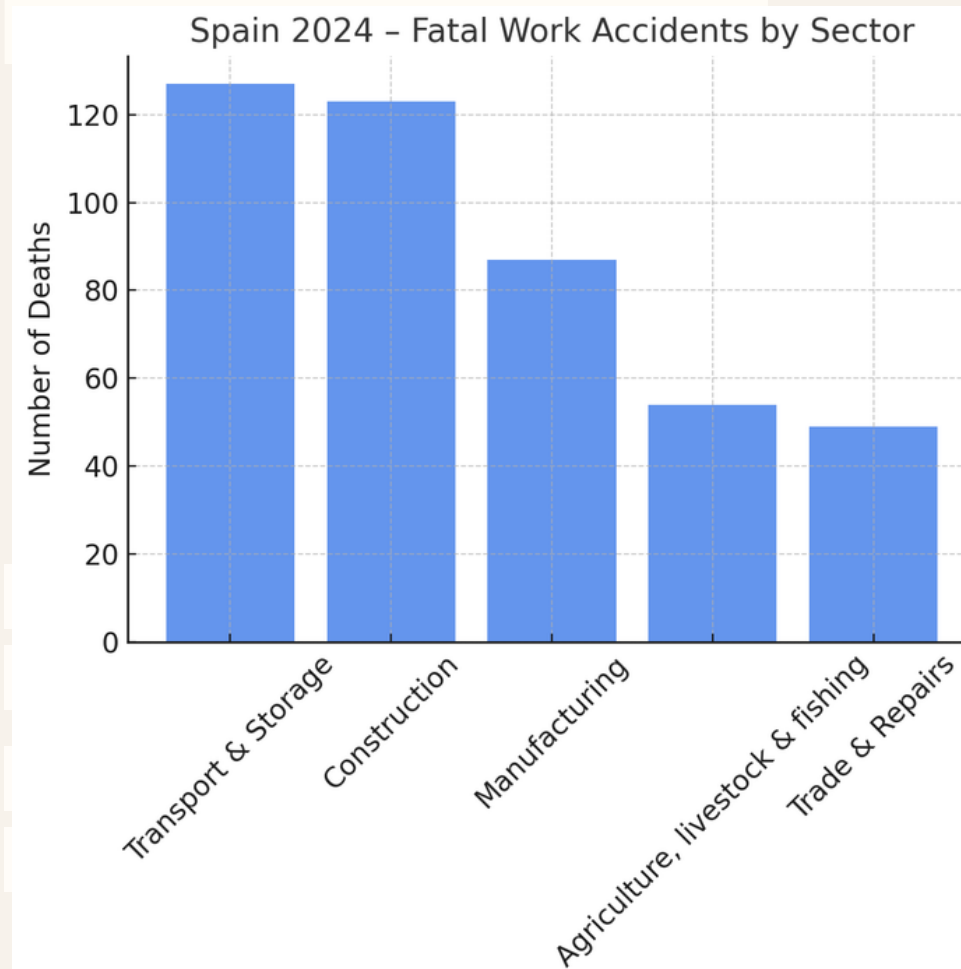

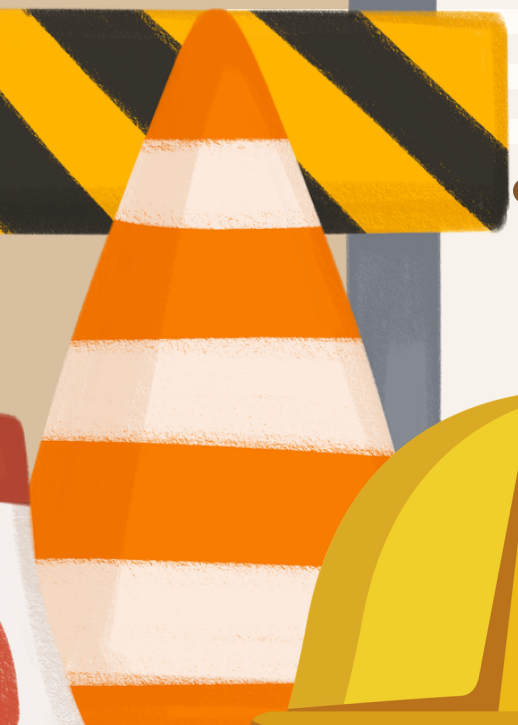

# TASK 2. DATA ANALYSIS AND SURVEY CREATION (10 MIN)



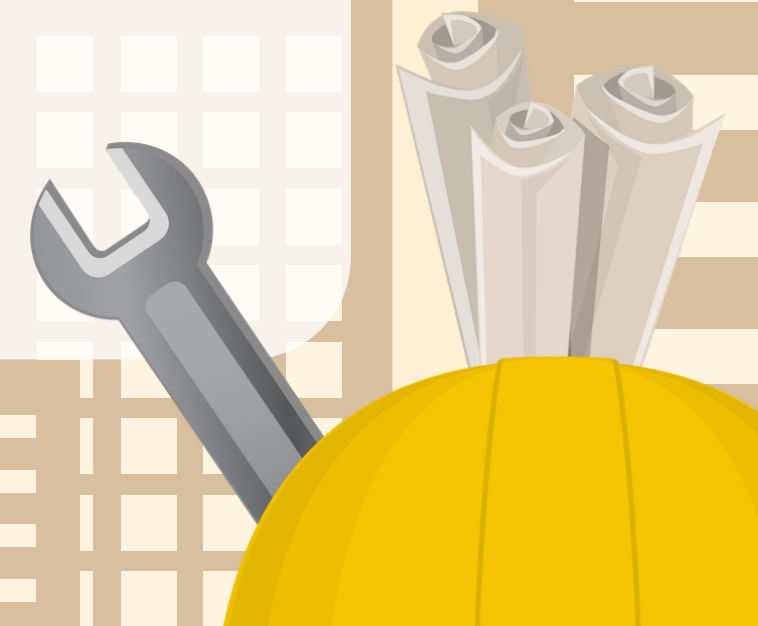
- Create a survey about what young Europeans know about safety measures at work, focusing on the jobs/sectors with the highest number of accidents that you have researched.
- The survey must have between 15 and 20 questions and each question must be multiple choice (up to 4 possible answers).
- The goal is to get real information about how much young people don't know about work accidents.
- One of the questions must ask for the age (use age ranges like “under 13 years old, between 13 and 15 years old, between 15 and 18 years old, over 18 years old) and the work situation (for example: studying or working).
- Use Google Forms: it is easy to create, easy to send to the people who will answer, and it gives clear final reports.

- All of the above.

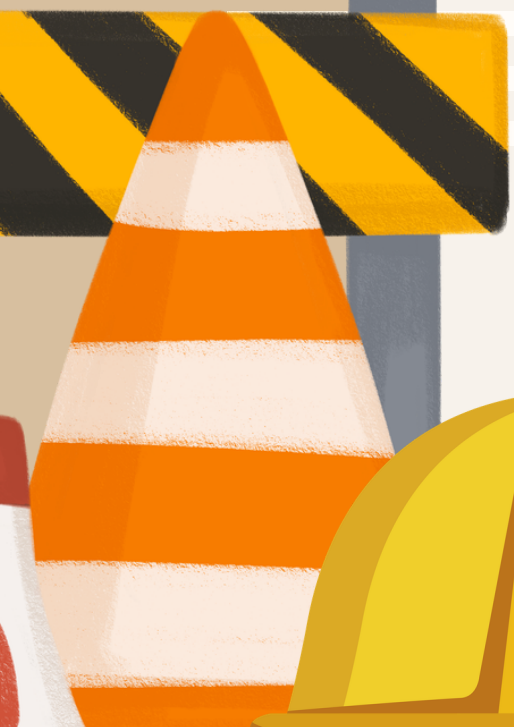
