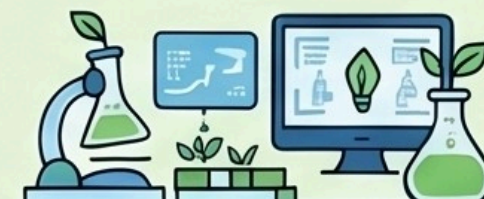

STEP 2: DIGITAL OUTPUTS AND eTWINNING CONTINUITY

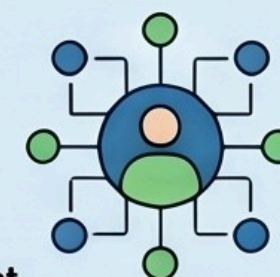
Active Digital Learning Spaces

STEP 3: FUTURE PARTNERSHIPS AND COLLABORATIONS

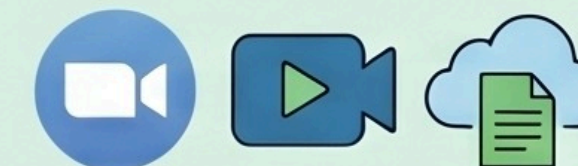
Ongoing Mentorship via LAB40

Institutionalizing Green Entrepreneurship Days

Partner schools organize annual events involving local chambers of commerce, municipalities, and labor market representatives.



Regional and National Mentorship

Turkish coordinator (mentor) and Spanish coordinator (ombassador) present project materials as guides to schools new to European projects.



Five-Year Digital Availability

Project website and educational platform, accessible to people with disabilities, remain active and updated for at least 5 years after project closure.
